- How to instruct the person who is being tested.

#### Instructions

- Ensure that the NexScreen™ Cup is at room temperature (59°-83°F).
- Open the pouch in Donor's presence.





- Ask the Donor to urinate directly into the NexScreen™ Cup and return it immediately.
- 4. Twist on the lid, ensuring that it is not cross-threaded. Tighten the lid completely, turning it as much as possible. This prevents leakage.





- Write down the time.
- 6. Verify that there is enough specimen (above the 30 ml minimum level line).
- 7. Verify that the specimen is near body temperature (90°-100°F). Look for a green indicator on the temperature strip.







- 8. Stick the security seal over the lid and down each side of the cup. Have the Donor initial the seal to attest that it is their specimen.
- 9. Remove the tear-off label.





Read the results between 5-10 minutes.

- A legend is printed on the cup to assist you with reading the results.
- Any evidence of a line is a line, no matter how faint.







#### How to Read the Results

- Test Results show as the presence or absence of red/pink lines on each strip.
- Any evidence of a line is a line, no matter how faint.
- Each strip has 2 possible lines:
  - 1) An upper line, called the **Control Line** 
    - Its presence means that the test is working.
    - Its absence means that the test is invalid.
  - 2) A lower line, called the **Test Line** 
    - Its presence means that the test is Negative for that drug.
    - Its absence means that the test is Positive, and should be sent to a lab for confirmation.

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#### How to Read the Results

- Read each strip independently of the other strips.
- Read <u>any</u> evidence of a line as a line, no matter how faint.

Image of strip:	What you see on a strip:	Result:	What to do:
	Control Line: present Test Line: absent	Positive	Record result, send cup to lab for confirmation testing
	Control Line: present Test Line: present	Negative	Record result and discard cup
OR	Control Line: absent Test Line: present or absent	Invalid	Record result, discard cup, and RETEST with another NexScreen™ Cup
